Victims of violent personal crimes such as sexual assault, domestic violence and homicide often know their attacker. This program offers tools to help women recognize abusive or predatory behavior in order to avoid relationships with potentially violent offenders. The program also addresses the significant increase in Drug Facilitated Sexual Assaults and how to avoid these situations.
